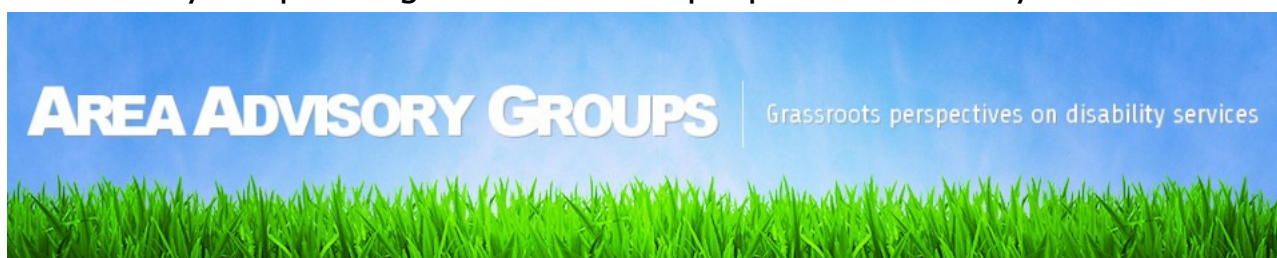
Speak Out and Advocacy Tasmania are helping to work out how people with disability can have a say at the Area Advisory Groups
